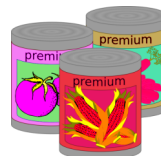
This week the 'Best Attendance Cup' goes to **Wrens** with **98.52%** attendance. Well done and thank you to parents for ensuring your child attends school everyday!

Our Learning this week

Reception

The reception children have been learning about the season of Autumn. The children went on an Autumn walk to look for changes in our school environment.



Year 1

World Mental Health Day 10/10/23

For World Mental Health Day we have been reading about the story of 'The Colour Monster' to help us explore different emotions. We have also talked about how we can use our class 'Worry Monster' to help us regulate our emotions when we are feeling worried or anxious. The children worked hard to create their own 'Worry Monsters' to take home.



Year 2

In History we have been using different sources of evidence to find out how our school has changed over time. We looked at old photographs, newspaper reports, maps and plans. We found out that our school was built 70 years ago in 1953. If any of our parents or grandparents came to this school, we would really like to find out more about what it was like in the past and how our school has changed.



The Nest

This week in the Nest we have been understanding the world by exploring the body and using our senses. We used loose parts to add the different body parts to our sketches. We have also used our senses to explore different fruits and vegetables.



Important Reminders

To report your child's absence call the school office on 01952 387860 before 8:50am. Should you require to collect your child early from school for an appointment could you please bring an appointment card or letter into the school office when collecting.



In order to keep your child safe if we have not been notified in advance of any change in collection arrangements we will not allow your child to leave without contacting you first.

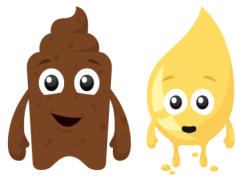
Other Useful Information
